
CE HISTORIC PRESERVATION SOCIETY PRESENTS:

It is most fitting that in 1986, the Town named its **Outstanding Citizen Award** for Ralph T. Gould, and made him the first recipient. Come find out why!




Tuesday, October 15 6:30 - 7:30 pm




